



Table Care Guide

Don't place very hot or cold items onto the table's surface. Use coasters and placemats to protect the table.

Dry any spills quickly to avoid staining.

Avoid placing tables directly beside fireplaces or radiators, or in very humid areas - this can cause cracking or warping over time.

Bright sunlight can affect the colour of your table. Avoid direct sunlight as much as possible, and rotate your table regularly to ensure even wear.

Always lift your table into place - dragging it across the floor could damage the floor and the cover.

Extending tables

When extending your table, make sure to lift it carefully. Dragging it can damage the legs.

Always keep your extending leaves in the storage section of the table when not in use.

Ensure there is enough space around your table for it to be extended safely.

Marble tables

Marble is a porous material and will absorb liquids, so take care to avoid spills and be careful when cleaning.

Don't use abrasive cleaners, chemicals or furniture polishes on marble. They will damage the surface.

Avoid acidic substances coming into contact with the marble.

Glass tables

Don't use the glass as a chopping board. Don't hit or strike the glass with sharp or pointed items.

Don't place anything very hot or cold on the glass. Use mats to protect the surface.

Don't use abrasive cleaners on the glass as these can scratch or damage the finish. Use a soft damp cloth to wipe the glass clean, then buff with a clean dry cloth. Washing up liquid can be a good choice to clean glass.

If the glass gets chipped or broken, stop using the product and contact the customer service line.

Never lift your glass table using the tabletop.

Wood tables

Don't forget, wood is a natural product and each piece is unique. The colour of the wood can change over time, and new items might vary in colour from pieces you already own.

Wooden furniture can be affected by temperature and humidity.

Always use mats and coasters when placing items onto the furniture to protect its surface.

If you're using your table for writing, make sure to place a mat or pad under the paper to protect the surface.

To protect wooden or laminate floors, make sure the plastic or felt protectors are secure and stay in place.

Wood can absorb liquids, so dry spills straight away to avoid staining.

When mopping around the table, avoid getting the legs of the table too wet.

Don't use abrasive or silicone polishes as they can affect the finish and joints over time. Ensure you are using the correct polish for your product - try a patch test in a hidden area before use.

Metal care

Use a clean dry cloth to dust the surface. Don't use abrasive cleaners or cloths: these can scratch the surface.

Don't use chemical cleaners or polishes. Clean stubborn marks with soapy water and a clean cloth. After cleaning, use a clean dry cloth to remove any smears.



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
